Embarking on higher education after completing your formal schooling or gaining work experience, is an exciting endeavour. NMMU can assist you to achieve your aspirations.

When am I considered a mature student?

A mature applicant is someone who is 23 years old before or during the year in which he/she wishes to enroll for a formal academic programme or; candidates older than 45 years who did not follow the formal secondary school route in the South African schooling system and aspire to enter higher education.

How do I apply?

When do I apply?

The closing date for applications for undergraduate study programmes is 1 August of each year.

What is Recognition of Prior Learning?

If necessary, their application will be referred to the Centre for Access Assessment and Research (CAAR).

How can I adequately prepare myself for life as a mature student?

Be clear and honest about the reasons why you want to study. Investigate the cost of studying to make adequate financial arrangements. As a mature student your demands and responsibilities are different to those of school leavers. Make sure that family members understand the importance of your studies and provide the necessary support.
